White Pine	70-100'	Moderately fast	Dry to moist	Full sun to part shade	Long, soft needles, State Tree of MI, used for wildlife and timber. Very salt sensitive.
Red Pine	65-100'	Fast	Dry to moist	Full sun	Reddish colored bark, used for windbreaks, timber and wildlife. Salt sensitive.
Jack Pine	40-60'	Fast	Dry	Full sun	Habitat for the endangered Kirkland's warbler. Used as Christmas trees and stabilization.
White Spruce	50-85'	Slow	Wet to moist	Full sun to part shade	Used for windbreaks, wildlife and landscaping. Preferred deer browse. Salt sensitive.
Black Spruce	25-60'	Very slow	Wet	Full sun to part shade	Resistant to winter injuries. Provides winter cover, nesting sites, and forage for wildlife. Used for landscape and windbreaks.
Balsam Fir	40-80'	Slow	Wet to moist	Shade	Less tolerant of poorly drained conditions. Popular Christmas tree.
White Cedar	30-50'	Very slow	Wet to moist	Shade	Used for wildlife. Preferred deer browse.
Paper Birch	40-70'	Fast	Dry to moist	Full sun	Used for wildlife. Used to restore drastically disturbed areas.
Silver Maple	60-100'	Fast	Wet to moist	Full sun	Used for wildlife. Used as an ornamental tree.
Tulip Poplar	60-110'	Very fast	Moist	Full sun	In the Magnolia tree family. Used as an ornamental tree. Some wildlife value.
White Oak	70-90'	Moderately slow	Dry to moist	Full sun to part shade	Long lived (500-600 years). Acorns are valuable wildlife food.
Chinquapin Oak	50-80'	Fast	Dry to moist	Full sun to part shade	Moderately shade tolerant, becoming intolerant. Thrives in moist bottomlands and stabilized sand dunes.
Shagbark Hickory	60-82'	Slow	Dry to moist	Full sun to part shade	Mature trees have shaggy bark, while young trees have smooth bark. Nut production is erratic, with good crops every 3 to 5 years.
Bigtooth Aspen	60-110'	Fast	Dry to moist	Full sun	Pioneer species - fast growing, primary species to grow in cleared or burned sites. Relatively short lived (50 years).
Black Walnut	60-90'	Very fast	Moist	Full sun	Used for timber and wildlife. Releases chemicals that harm some other plants. Salt sensitive. Intolerant to very dry or wet sites.
Redbud	12-25'	Slow	Moist	Full sun to part shade	Ornamental tree. Blossoms in April, flowers are a rosey pink. Attracts butterflies and birds.
Red-Osier Dogwood	7-10'	Fast	Moist to wet	Full sun to part shade	Ornamental tree. Flowers are small and white, tree blossoms from May to August. Attracts birds.
Flowering Dogwood	16-33'	Very slow	Dry to moist	Shade	Intolerant of flooded sites. Ornamental tree. Blossoms in May/early June. Flowers are white or pinkish. Attracts butterflies and birds.
Witch-hazel	10-33'	Slow	Dry to moist	Shade	Ornamental tree. Flowers in October or November, bright yellow. Attracts butterflies and birds.
Buttonbush	5-12'	Moderate	Moist to wet	Full sun to part shade	Ornamental and wildlife use. Flowers are white or pink, bloom time is June through September, and attracts butterflies, birds, and bees.
Apple Tree, Cortland Apple	15-20'	Moderate	Well-drained	Full sun	Apples are a general purpose favorite. Requires another apple tree of a different variety to pollinate.
Apple Tree, Honey Crisp	12-15'	Moderate	Well-drained	Full sun	Crisp, predominantly sweet. Developed specifically for growers in cold climates, one of the most cold-hardy apple varieties. Requires another apple tree of a different variety to pollinate.
Peach Tree, Redhaven	15-25'	Moderate	Well-drained	Full sun	All-purpose peach. Almost fuzzless skin. Self-pollinating.
Plum Tree, Elephant Heart	18-20'	Moderate	Well-drained	Full sun	Sweet, juicy, rich flavor. The skin is described as having a berry-like flavor. Great for fresh eating. Requires another variety of fruit to cross-pollinate.
Raspberries, Heritage	4'	Moderate	Well-drained	Full sun	Requires maintenance. Hardy, disease-resistant variety. Often used for fresh eating, cooking, baking, and preserves. Self-pollinating.
Blueberries, Blue Crop	4-6'	Moderate	Well-drained	Full sun	All-purpose blueberries. Self-fertile. Blooms in May, with white flowers. Turns fiery red during fall.
Strawberries, Fraises Des Bois	8-12'	Moderate	Well-drained	Full sun	Berries of the Woods'. Flowers and fruits throughout the summer months. Self-fertile.
